# APPLYING AND INTERVIEWING FOR FACULTY POSITIONS

# **Questions Applicants Should Be Prepared to Answer**

#### Research

Describe your dissertation research. (Have a short and long version prepared.) In what way does your research contribute significantly to your field of study? What is the current 'cutting edge' in your field? In what way does your research address it? Do you plan to revise your dissertation for publication? What do you need to do to accomplish that? Tell us about your mentor(s). Evaluate his/her ideas. (Keep it very positive.)

What is the most significant piece of research that you have read in the last year?

Have you had grant writing experience? If so, what was the outcome?

### **Teaching**

What classes have you taught? What courses would you like to teach?

What would you include if you taught a course in...? What textbook would you use?

What concepts would you want the students in (name of course) to understand and apply?

What is your preferred method of course evaluation?

How do you structure/organize courses?

What is your basic teaching philosophy?

If we could speak to your students, what would they tell us about you?

How are you able to bring the insights of your research into the classroom?

#### Role/Commitment

Why do you want to be a faculty member at our institution? (Do your homework.)

This is a research institution. What would make you a successful candidate for tenure?

At our institution, teaching is the first priority and the teaching load is significant. How will you survive/thrive in it?

To what extent are you willing to participate in departmental committees, outside committees, and extracurricular events?

What do you think are the advantages and disadvantages of this position?

What kind of commitment are you willing to make to this institution? (i.e., how long do you plan to stay?)

Are you willing to establish collaborations with local/regional institutions?

In what ways do you see yourself making professional contributions in the next five years?

What can you contribute to our faculty? Our students?

Describe some innovative approaches for increasing our enrollment.

## Common/general

Tell us about yourself. (This one should be memorable but relatively short.)

Refresh our memory; tell us about your academic preparation and experience (your vita in conversational form).

Five/ten years from now, where do you see yourself professionally?

Identify your greatest strengths and weaknesses. What have you done to eliminate the latter?

## **Questions Applicants Should Be Prepared to Ask**

#### Curriculum

What graduate and undergraduate courses would likely be my responsibility? (Know the courses taught in the department.)

What is the average semester/quarter teaching load? How are labs counted?

How often are course load assignments changed?

Are there field-based supervisory duties assigned to the position

By what means are curriculum and program development decisions made?

#### **Related to Duties**

What provisions are made for office space? Research space?

What is the average number of graduate advisees?

What is the average number of office hours?

What is the availability of teaching and/or research assistants?

What is the average number of hours per week spent on committee work?

How active are the members of the faculty in local, state, and national professional organizations?

Describe the ideal candidate for this position.

### **Promotion and Tenure**

What is the basis for promotion and tenure?

By what methods are faculty evaluated?

How many faculty members have become tenured in the last few years in the department, and at what point? What have been the rate of and reason for faculty turnover?

#### Research-related

How is collaborative research viewed on this campus? (Know the current faculty's research ahead of time.) What kind of laboratory facilities are available for my research? (Be prepared with a list of equipment needs and a budget.)

What in-house support is available for research?

Describe the travel budget. What support is provided for conference attendance?

#### **Finances**

What salary is anticipated for the position?

What nonsalary benefits are associated with the position?

What is the moving expense policy?

Is there funding for sabbatical leaves?

What are the possibilities for and /or restrictions on summer school teaching?

#### **School and Community**

Characterize the student population in terms of geographical, economic, ethnic, and scholarship range.

What is the relationship among the town, the local schools, and the university?

What cultural opportunities exist in the community?

What is the cost of living in the community?

What kind of housing is available? Are there any home loan programs for faculty?
